Transport Research Seminar (Lecture Theatre (G.07), Transport) 1:30-2:30pm

"Pollution or congestion charging? Air quality measures and road pricing in Milan, Italy" presented by Dr Giulio Mattioli (ITS, University of Leeds).

Air pollution is increasingly perceived as a problem in British cities, with policy makers struggling to comply with EU regulations. While road pricing is now unanimously considered as unacceptable to the public following failed referendums, London is planning the introduction of an Ultra-Low Emission Zone.

The presentation argues that there are lessons to be learned from the experience of Milan, where chronic air pollution has been debated for many years. Unlike other cities, it is concerns for the levels of pollution (rather than congestion) that have led to the introduction of the 'Ecopass' scheme (2008). This was upgraded to a congestion charge ('Area C') in 2012, following a referendum where 80% of voters demanded a tightening up of the scheme. Overall Milan's experience, while little known internationally, highlights interesting relationships between public acceptance of road pricing, air quality measures, city politics and EU regulations.

Food Waste: Research, Consumer and Society Based Solutions

More than a third of all of the food that's produced on our planet never reaches a table. It's either spoiled in transit or thrown out by consumers in wealthier countries, who typically buy too much and toss the excess. If food waste were a country, it would be the world's third largest emitter of greenhouse gases, behind the U.S. and China.

Steps are being taken to raise our awareness of food waste and its social, economic and environmental impacts, but we need to do more. The University of Leeds, together with Asda, Love Food Hate Waste and The Real Junk Food Project warmly invite you to explore how we can all make a difference. Keynote speakers from Sustainability Research Institute, Asda, LFHW, and The Real Junk Food Project, will each give an insight into the impact of food waste and solutions.

- Consumer's behaviour: what can you do to waste less and save more
- Community based solutions to food waste
